
BEGINNER COURSE


Anatomy of the Guitar





The Strings

Below you can see a scheme with the numbers and notes correspondent to all "open" strings. It's important to know these notes because you'll need them to tune your guitar and this is how we will be naming them on the following videos.



Notes: E A D G B E Number of the strings: 6 5 4 3 2 1

Renaming your fingers

In order to read scores and tablatures in a practical way, guitarists named their fingers of the left hand with numbers and the right hand with the first letter of the spanish name given to each finger. In Spain, the thumb is called "pulgar, the index finger is "indice", the middle finger "medio" or "mayor" and the ring finger is called "anular", therefore we use this PIMA nomenclature. You will be seeing a lot of these signs in scores, tablatures and chords charts, so it is important to get acquainted.
